Meet the Cast & Directors:

Laura Childs (Ensemble/Tart): Laura is an 18 year old graduating senior from DuQuoin High School who plans to enter the pre-med program at St. Louis University in the fall. This is her fourth Pyramid Players production. Laura was a 2007 IHSA State Speech Qualifier in humorous interpretation and is no stranger to the stage. Past roles include Eulalie MacKechnie Shinn in the Pyramid Players production of *The Music Man* and Mae Peterson in DuQuoin High School's production of *Bye, Bye Birdie*.

Andrew Chismar (Tom's Gang) Andrew is a 19 year old elementary education major who will be entering SIUC in the fall. This is Andrew's first Pyramid Players show, but he was active in the Frankfort Community High School drama department where he appeared in *Music Man* as Mayor Shinn, *Once Upon a Mattress*, and *Oklahoma*. Outside of theatre, Andrew enjoys cheering on his favorite team, the St. Louis Cardinals and hanging out with his friends. He would like to thank all of his family and friends for all their love and support.

James Coble (Man on Skiff/Ensemble) James is a 20 year old music education major at SIU-Carbondale and this is his first Pyramid Players production. He attended Flora High School where he appeared as Slim in the school musical, *Oklahoma*.

Trevor has been with the Pyramid Players since he was six years old. In high school, Trevor qualified for the IHSA state finals for two years in dramatic duet acting, placed fourth in state in the contest play, *On Stars Not Falling*, and performed in the All-State production of *Les Miserables* at the Illinois High School Theatre Festival. Favorite roles include Woodstock in *Snoopy*, the barbershop quartet in *The Music Man*, and Lt. Cable in *South Pacific*.

Dillon Heape (Duke) Dillon is an 18 year old graduate of DuQuoin High School and will be attending the University of Evansville this fall as a theatre performance major. He has been involved in 10 Pyramid Players productions. Dillon was the 2006 IHSA State Runner-up and the 2007 IHSA State Champion in prose reading and was chosen to perform the role of Thenardier in the All-State Musical *Les Miserables* at the Illinois High School Theatre Festival. Favorite roles include Professor Harold Hill (and Winthrop!) in the Pyramid Players productions of *The Music Man*, Cogsworth in SIU-C's production of *Beauty and the Beast*, and Drake in the Pyramid Players production of *Honk!*

Cheryl Herman (Pit Orchestra Director) Cheryl is a graduate of Benton Consolidated High School. She attended Southern Illinois University, where she served as accompanist for SIU Male Glee Club and University Chorus under the direction of Robert Kingsbury. She has accompanied for several choral festivals throughout Southern Illinois, area high school musicals, and has directed the pit orchestras for productions with Pyramid Players, Southeastern Illinois College, and Rend Lake College in the past. After an almost 30-year hiatus, Cheryl has returned to SIU-C to complete her music degree. She plans to graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Music-Open Studies in December, 2007.

Tom Herman (King) Tom is a resident of Benton where he works at Title Insurance, but is a familiar face in theatres across southern Illinois. Tom has performed with the Paradise Alley Players, Southeastern Illinois College, Rend Lake College, and several other local theatre groups. This is his thirteenth Pyramid Players production. Favorite roles have included Horace Vandergelder in the Pyramid Players production of *Hello, Dolly*, Scrooge in the SIC production of *A Christmas Carol*, and Herr Schultz in the SIC production of *Cabaret*.

Christian Hoffman (Tom's Gang/Ensemble) Christian is a 15 year old sophomore attending Benton High School. Christian is active in the BCHS speech team, madrigals, jazz choir, drama productions, and band. He also qualified for the 2007 IHSA State tournament in performance in the round. You might remember Christian earlier this summer as Buffalo Bill in Pyramid Players' *Annie Get Your Gun*.

Joe has been involved in five Pyramid Players productions, but his favorite roles have been the lieutenant in *Arsenic and Old Lace* and the drunken judge in *State Fair*.

Marianne Kaak (Miss Watson/Ensemble) Marianne is a substitute teacher and over-committed volunteer! She is the chairman of the Franklin County Arts Association and has been involved in six Pyramid Players productions. In 1966, Marianne was a member of the IHSA State Champion Speech Team from Woodruff High School in Peoria. Several years later she is still performing. Her favorite role has been Aunt Martha in *Arsenic and Old Lace*, a reprise of her senior class play, 40 years earlier!



Allan Kimball (Director) Allan is the theatre director at Southeastern Illinois College and co-founder of the Pyramid Players. He has directed and been the tech director for the Pyramid Players since it began in 1977. He also worked as scenic designer for Carbondale Community Arts. He has his master's degree in performance studies from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. Although Allan prefers to be behind the scenes, directing and doing technical work, he has made several candid appearances including a reprise of his 1976 role of the FBI man in the 2005 production of *Arsenic and Old Lace*. This is the second time Allan has directed *Big River* for the Pyramid Players and it has always been one his favorite productions. Besides his numerous productions with Southeastern Illinois College and the Pyramid Players, Allan directed the Benton High School contest plays, *Joe Egg*, which was the IHSA State Champion Runner-up and *On Stars Not Falling*, which placed fourth in state in the IHSA series. For fourteen years, he directed drama and coached speech at DuQuoin High School, producing an award winning speech team and an IHSA state champion. He would like to thank Rend Lake College and its surrounding communities for all their support throughout the years.

Josh Kimball (Tom's Gang/Ensemble) Practically born into the theatre, Josh has been involved in Pyramid Players productions since he was five years old. Besides being an active member of the BCHS speech team, madrigals, jazz choir, band, and drama department, Josh has performed with Carbondale Community Arts, Artstarts, John A. Logan College, Southeastern Illinois College, and Rend Lake College. He was a 2007 IHSA State Qualifier in dramatic duet acting and has been chosen to perform in the All-State musical, *Parade*, at the Illinois High School Theatre Festival this year. Favorite roles have included Mereb in this summer's SIU-C production of *Aida*, Rum Tum Tugger in *Cats*, and Oliver in *Oliver!*.

Justin Kimball (Huck) Justin recently completed his freshman year at Millikin University where he is pursuing a BFA in music theatre. Justin began performing with the Pyramid Players at the age of 4 and has performed in over 25 Pyramid Players productions. He was the 2006 IHSA State Runner-up in Original Comedy, the 2005 State Champion in humorous interpretation, and a member of the cast of *On Stars Not Falling* which placed fourth in the state. Justin also performed in the 2005 all-state musical, *Ragtime*. As a freshman at Millikin, he was the only freshman to be chosen to perform in both main stage musicals and this summer he performed in SIU-C's McCleod Summer Playhouse production of *Thoroughly Modern Millie*. Favorite roles include Gaston in SIU-C's *Beauty and the Beast* and Snoopy in the BCHS production of *Snoopy*.

Pam Kimball (Widow Douglas/Ensemble) Pam has been the speech coach and drama director at Benton High School for 27 years and has been performing with the Pyramid Players since 1981. She is also co-director of the Pyramid Players children's musicals. Although running her two theatrically-minded sons from rehearsal to rehearsal has kept her busy over the past 19 years, she has also performed roles at SIU-C and Southeastern Illinois College.
